


Although it looks suspiciously like the jeep from last year's VBS, this rover has gotten an out-of-this-world makeover and is ready to haul all sorts of good things for God.

Bonus: Making of Expedition Space

This year's VBS is a home-grown affair featuring originally produced lesson plans, activities, music and even computer animation. And as in real spaceflight, it took a crew as big as the USS Fellowship to get this spaceship off the ground to go exploring God's awesome universe.

And when we talk about the USS Fellowship, we can actually picture the real thing thanks to the computer animated talents of Mike Brant. Mike worked with the VBS creative team to come up with a design for our ship and then actually render it into a series of special effects that will be seen throughout the week at VBS.

The most important thing about the design of the ship is that it had to be big enough to hold a crew of nearly 400 people and make room for more than a dozen shuttlecraft classrooms where our cadets train for their mission to share the Good News with all.

The ship turned out to be something of a cross between Star Trek's USS Voyager, the Battlestar Galactica and a futuristic concept for an airliner design that NASA's aeronautical innovators are working on. Pretty amazing, huh?

One of the other lesser known facts about this year's VBS is that our Expedition Space theme song is an
