
These Golden State Worshippers (above) appear to be practicing for tonight's Parade of Champions, part of the big finish planned for the VBS 2017 All Star Games.

Counting sheep a game to stay awake for

A busy week at the VBS 2017 All Star Games will conclude tonight with the Sun Bowl and Medal Ceremonies in Son Light Stadium at Weber Field.

No doubt the excitement will continue into the evening and make it difficult to fall asleep.

If you're among those who use the trick of counting sheep to help you doze off, then you may have the skills to compete in an Australian contest that first took place in 2002.

Raising sheep is a big deal in Australia, and those who work in the business of at auction are required to keep track of their sheep

by counting them one by one — sometimes as many as 60,000 a day.

Fifteen years ago, in Australia, farmers were facing something of a draught, and the auctioneers found their business slow down to a crawl, leaving them with much less to do.

Local businessmen in the city of Hay, 450 miles west of Sydney, decided to cheer everyone up with a sheep counting contest.

The way the contest worked that first time is that about 400 sheep were sent running past sets of 10 sheep counters at a time. buying and selling of sheep
The exact number of sheep to pass each contestant was different for each play-




er. The person who came closest to the exact number was declared the winner.

In the first competition, the winner beat 100 other contestants by correctly counting exactly 277 sheep who passed in front of him.

It's not clear from a search of the Internet if the contest is still held in Australia, or if it's moved to other nations.

Perhaps this is something to be done at next year's VBS? Any volunteers willing to organize the event?
