NSCFL Awards

Each year the NSCFL honors deserving individuals who have made significant contributions to America's space program while working in Florida with the following awards:

Dr. Kurt H. Debus Award

Named for the first director of the Kennedy Space Center, this award recognizes a person who has made a particularly important contribution to the space program during the past year while working on Florida's Space Coast. It is our most prestigious honor and is presented during a formal dinner event.

Lifetime Achievement Award

This award recognizes those who have spent their career making important contributions to our space program here on Florida's Space Coast.

Harry Kolcum Memorial News & Communications Award

Named for the late aerospace writer who worked for Aviation Week Space Technology, this award recognizes the contributions of professional Florida-based journalists and communicators to inform the public about launch and mission operations.

Rising Star Award

This award recognizes "above & beyond" accomplishments of young achievers who have made contributions to the space industry in Florida through either technical, education, or leadership activities related to aerospace.

Forrest S. McCartney National Defense Space Award

Named for an Air Force three-star general and former director of the Kennedy Space Center, this award honors Florida-stationed space professionals who make significant contributions to our nation's defense.

Space Worker Hall of Fame

This award honors those who have made significant contributions to our space program in all areas of launch and mission operations including Space Launch Technology, Space Flight Support, Human Spaceflight Advancement, and Space Flight Advocacy and Education.
